

What's the Book of Ezekiel About?

Ezekiel was called by God in a supernatural and amazing vision that displayed God's greatness. Ezekiel lived among the Jewish exiles in Babylon, who had been taken captive when King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple. God sent Ezekiel to proclaim a message of judgment for sins committed. But, in His mercy, God offered hope through the prophet and promised that the people would one day be restored to the land for His name's sake.

Weird Words

Exile - Not being allowed to live in your own country. *For the Israelites this was because they were taken to Babylon*





Israel was split into 2 Kingdoms - the North and the South. The Northern Kingdom disobeyed God and was eventually faced God's anger as He gave their land to a new people. The Southern Kingdom lasted longer, but what happened to them in 2 Kings 25:8-11?
